Message from Chair of Governors

Once again it has been a challenging year for all at Henry Cort, with Governors, Staff, students and parents having to navigate their way through the ongoing changes in the education system.

We have seen some changes in personnel on the Governing Board and I would like to thank Mr Chris Harper, Mr Stuart Warner and Mrs Lourentia Doyle for their invaluable contribution to the Governing Board over their terms of office.

In filling the vacancies left by our departing governors, we have been fortunate to welcome Mrs Sara Smith, Mr Ian Brewerton and Mr Andy Ford, who have all “hit the ground running” and are already adding to the skills and knowledge of the board as a whole.

It will perhaps come as no surprise that scrutiny of the college budget has been at the forefront of our work this year. There has been much publicity in the press on the state of school funding and there should be little doubt that budgets are extremely tight.

I, together with Mr Mike Hartnell (Assistant Principal) was fortunate enough to be invited by our local

MP, Suella Fernandes to meet with the Minister for Schools - The Rt Hon Nick Gibb MP to discuss this subject and put forward our views on the governments proposed funding formula.

Senior leaders, together with the finance team have done an outstanding job to balance the books for this year, but with the uncertainty about future funding this remains a significant challenge.

Governors are committed to having the best teachers and the widest possible education opportunities for students, so we are making every effort to avoid cuts to our professional development and curriculum offer. This will require imaginative solutions and ever closer working relationships with our neighbouring schools and colleges.

The other main area of our work has been understanding the new way in which we assess the progress of students. I know parents have been involved in the way they receive reports on their child’s progress and that there are perhaps some improvements to be made.

This is a completely new way of looking at how students are doing and some teething problems are inevitable. It has been a significant

task to ensure the results and data are meaningful and I am confident that over time we will have a very powerful tool to ensure each individual student is making the best progress possible - governors will be regularly revisiting this, as more data becomes available.

Finally, we believe it likely Ofsted will visit the college in the next school year and governors, along with the staff are preparing for this, ensuring we maintain our rating as a “good” school and looking to move up to the next level of “outstanding”.

Such success is a reflection of the hard work and commitment of all concerned, including staff, students and parents and I would like to thank you for your continuing support.

I hope you are all able to enjoy some rest and relaxation over the summer, ready to face the challenges of a new school year in September.

Transition Matters – Successful workshops prepare students for life beyond primary school

Most 11-year-olds should be looking forward to secondary school. They are changing physically and emotionally, and are ripe for new challenges.

The prospect of a range of teachers, richer resources and a new style of learning fires them through summer so that, come September, they should be ready to fly. However, an article published in the TES 'Primary/Secondary Transition', states that all the evidence points to the contrary, children starting secondary school, even those lucky ones entering the school of their choice, find that far from being launched into a brave new adventure, they are reassessed, their previous work and achievements are undervalued, and they are forced to mark time going over old ground. A series of studies over the past 20 years shows students regressing between the last year of primary and the end of the first year of secondary school. Primary-secondary transition is now

regarded as the crucial time, when learners drop out or are made for life.

In light of this research, The Henry Cort Community College places a great deal of emphasis on ensuring a robust transition programme for students which includes workshops, summer school and an induction day.

We have had a good response to the Saturday morning workshops this year, with large numbers of Year 5 and Year 6 students and their parents attending taster sessions in a range of subject areas. For the children, this is an important opportunity to spend more time on the college campus, becoming more familiar with the surroundings. They also met teachers that they will be working with and gained an insight into some of the activities and subjects that they will be studying.

Enthusiastic staff gave up their Saturday mornings to enable these valuable sessions to happen. Over the three workshops, the children have participated in Maths, Science, Modern Foreign Languages, Physical Education, English, Art and Design Technology.

Parents of Year 6 took part in their own workshops during the final session. They participated in Art, Maths,

Science and Communication workshops. Some were undoubtedly a little nervous as they stepped back into the classroom for the first time in a while but all emerged at the end of the morning, smiling and having enjoyed their experiences. Many commented that they wished that their own school experiences had been as good.

The opportunity to share the experience that the children are going to be facing when they start in September is helpful in understanding what is involved in each of the different subjects studied at Henry Cort.

Mrs Warner, Transition Co-ordinator, has visited all the Year 6 children in their primary schools this term in addition to the Year 6 Transition Day. We look forward to welcoming them all in September.
