Principal's Update

We have reached the end of our first and very busy term. Year 11s have just completed a full set of Pre Public Exams, with Year 10 taking their RE exam – results will be available early in the new year.

Our Year 11 summer leavers achieved an excellent set of results amidst the turbulence surrounding the GCSE changes and shifts in grade boundaries in a number of the key subjects. The unprecedented changes to English and Mathematics means that they cannot be directly compared to previous years as the exams have more challenging content and are assessed differently. The college continued with its steady improvement and we are proud that 50% of our students met the new 'strong pass' benchmark of achieving a 5+ in English and Mathematics which placed us in the top 30% of schools. Ex-Head Boy,

Kieran Elliot, achieved 12 A*/A, or equivalent, including the new coveted Grade 9 within all three of the new GCSE examinations: Mathematics, English Language and English Literature – the only student in the Fareham area to have achieved this.

Master Sculptor Donald Brown delivers an inspiring masterclass

A group of Year 10 students were engaged and inspired by a sculpting masterclass delivered

by Donald Brown, Master Sculptor and CEO of The Global Gallery Limited on Wednesday 15



November.

World renowned sculptor Donald Brown has dedicated his varied career as an artist and globally conscious entrepreneur to humanising art for all people to understand and appreciate by making his works relevant to real life issues.



The creation of his latest masterpiece, titled "A Sporting Chance for Peace" created over a period of four years, is the flagship for a Personal Peace Initiative spearheaded by Donald. The sculpture that blends the two great passions of his life, art and sports, features a dynamic interaction of people engaged in various sporting activities and also functions as symbols of

human behaviour and ideals. His masterpiece is used as a vehicle to promote Personal Peace and the positive principles that are taught through sports, such as respect, discipline, humility and honesty.

A replica of his masterpiece was used to lead an inspirational

masterclass to a group of 14 Year 10 students to help them gain first-hand understanding of the sculptural process used.

They worked with traditional handheld tools to create their own unique clay sculpture. Donald got the students working together and thinking creatively and they were encouraged to put their work into context.

Ms Cabbage, Principal, said: *"It was really pleasing to see the students buzzing after completing their own contextual sculptures."*

Donald Brown remarked

"It is always a pleasure when I am fortunate to work with students who are so well disciplined and keen to learn. The sculptures that the students produced were a testament to them listening and applying a positive meaning to their works. A fantastic day, great students and wonderful staff."

In addition to the masterclass, Donald was invited to join the

Class of 2017 Presentation Evening as guest speaker. During the evening, an inspiring speech was given about where he came from and his journey so far.

He introduced his Patrons Plan which offered parents the opportunity to be purchase a print of the 'A Sporting Chance for Peace' Sculpture. The Patrons Plan will allow 50 parents to purchase one print each at a cost of £35.00 each.

Their purchases would guarantee an Open Edition replica of the sculpture for Henry Cort completely free of charge. All 50 parents would become the Patrons of the sculpture for The Henry Cort Community College with their names included on the Patron's Plaque Honour Roll placed permanently by the sculpture.

Henry Cort wins award for Young Carers support

We are proud to announce that we have been given a Bronze award for our work to ensure students do not miss out on an education because they are young carers.

The Young Carers in Schools programme helps primary and secondary schools improve outcomes for young carers and celebrates good practice through the Young Carers in Schools Award.

Ms Cabbage said "A huge amount of work has gone into achieving this award and Mrs Vickers works tirelessly to support our Young Carers. This group of students often get overlooked and it is vitally important that they have the opportunity to 'be a child' both in and out of school".

Young carers are responsible for emotional, practical or physical care for a parent, sibling or other family member who has a physical disability, mental health issue or substance misuse issue. The 2011 Census statistics revealed that there are just over 166,000 young carers in England, but research reveals that this is just the tip of the iceberg. The true figure could be closer to 700,000 young carers in England, equivalent to 1 in 12 school children, many of whom are unrecognised and unsupported.

To achieve our Bronze Award we

have demonstrated that we support young carers in many ways, including homework clubs and drop-in sessions with a member of staff who is responsible for this vulnerable group of pupils. Vital information about how to identify young carers is made available to all school staff, and noticeboards and the college website to let students and their families know where to go for help.

We are one of only three schools to pilot the Public Health and HC3S Healthy Eating Project

Secondary teams from HC3S are working with Public Health to improve the access to and uptake of healthier choices in three secondary schools in Hampshire.

Their objectives are to achieve a reduction in sugary drinks/foods sold in targeted schools, increase in the offer and uptake of healthier food and drinks choices and for 3 secondary schools to be awarded the Eat Out Eat Well award by the end of March 2018. The food trials started on Wednesday 29 November with approximately 12 students who tasted and completed a short survey with their feedback.



MP Caroline Dinenage has an enterprising visit to Henry Cort

The Careers and Enterprise visit took place on Friday 13 October. It was an opportunity for Caroline to learn more about the Careers and Enterprise Company and how the company has brought together local schools, business providers and the Solent Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) to support young people.

The Solent Local Enterprise Partnership (LEP) was formed after the Government offered local areas the opportunity to take control of their future economic development. It is a locally-owned partnership between businesses and local authorities and plays a central role in determining local economic priorities and undertaking activities to drive economic growth and the creation of local jobs.

The Solent LEP is led by the business community and supported by three university partners, the further education sector, three unitary authorities, eight district councils, one county council and the voluntary and community sector – all working together to secure a more prosperous and sustainable future for the Solent area.

The visit saw examples of how the network has delivered real value in the Solent area. Presentations were received

from Claudia Harris, CEO of Careers and Enterprise Company, Jade Fuller, Enterprise Coordinator for Solent LEP and two representatives from The Henry Cort Community College.

Ms Cubbage said *“At Henry Cort we aim for outstanding achievement for all students through a supportive and individualised approach, encouraging perseverance and respect in our pursuit of excellence. We are working towards achieving the 8 Gatsby benchmarks and have created an integrated careers programme which maximises opportunities for students to engage with employers and post 16 institutions so that we provide sufficient and timely advice to enable students to make informed choices about their future.”*



The Henry Cort Community College’s enterprise spirit permeates through every aspect of college life. Students are encouraged to identify challenges and find creative solutions to achieve success. They liaise with local colleges and businesses to develop a skilled and motivated workforce of the future. The timetable enables them to enhance the curriculum to deliver innovative activities

engaging students in enterprising ways.

The Henry Cort Community College is proud to be one of the first schools to be part of a pilot linked with a business enterprise advisor network to develop careers education which gives students a real understanding of the world of work. In Year 10, students undertake work experience. In the lower years students are encouraged to participate in a PiXL Edge programme which develops employability and leadership skills.

Mr Gellett, Assistant Principal said *“The Henry Cort Community College has established a strong relationship with Taylor Made Computer Solutions as a result of the Solent LEP and are looking for other local businesses to work with us.”*

MP Caroline Dinenage spoke passionately about her priorities in her constituency and discussed working together in the future to encourage the growth of the Network in Gosport. Caroline

remarked *“It was great to visit Henry Cort Community College to learn more about the Careers and Enterprise Company. Ensuring students have enterprise and career skills are key to making sure our young people are prepared for the world of work.”*
