### **Noun phrase:**

A noun phrase is a simple phrase built around a noun. It contains a determiner and a noun.

For example: a tree, some sweets, the castle

### **Expanded noun phrase**

An expanded noun phrase adds more detail to the noun by adding one or more adjectives. An adjective is a word that describes a noun.

For example: a huge tree, some colourful sweets, the large, royal castle

An expanded noun phrase can also add detail by saying where a noun is.

For example: a tree next to the house, some sweets on the floor, the castle by the ocean.

Writers use adjectives and expanded noun phrases to make their writing more descriptive. They help to give the reader a better picture in their head of what the writer is trying to describe.

For example, the expanded noun phrase 'a cute, baby elephant' gives you a much clearer picture than just writing 'the elephant' would.

A **relative clause** can be used to give additional information about a **noun** (naming word). They can be used to create **complex sentences** as they are a type of **subordinate clause**.

**Relative clauses** come directly after the noun they are referring to. This might be at the end of a sentence or embedded into the middle of a sentence. If embedded into the middle of a sentence, the relative clause is usually surrounded by commas.

#### Relative pronouns

Relative clauses are introduced by a **relative pronoun**. The relative pronoun you will use depends on the person or type of thing you are writing about.

Relative pronouns include:

- Who - a person or people
- Which - an object, a place or animals
- That - an object, a place or a person
- When - a time
- Where - a place

For example, look at these two simple sentences:

The Cubs took part in a challenge. They were in their house.

They were in their house is extra information, so this forms the relative clause.

Below, the relative pronoun, 'who', is used to create a relative clause so these two simple sentences can be connected.

The Cubs, who were in their house, took part in a challenge.

Yesterday, a group of Cubs completed a challenge to climb Mount Everest by climbing their stairs as part of a 'stay at home' challenge.

Seventeen Cubs and four leaders, who are from the Stockport area, completed the grueling challenge over 48 hours. In total, the group managed to climb a mammoth 8907 meters, which is 59 meters higher than Everest itself.



To help get into the mountaineering spirit, the intrepid climbers geared up in their climbing kit, that included goggles, gloves and ski jackets.
