## Maths Day 1 (Autumn term 2)

We would like you to spend the next two days practising to tell the time.

Start by looking at a clock. You can draw one if you don't have an analogue clock at home, or if you are feeling adventurous there are some lovely ideas online for making your own paper plate clock!



Discuss what the parts of the clock are and how the hands move.
